Got Your Back: By Susan Flowers

Last Sunday in church we talked about change and changing, and willingness to change if God calls you to do so. Change is scary for me. I kind of like things to move along like they always have — no rocking boats, etc. The Lord has used Jim to let me know that change is a good thing if it is of the Lord. And the changes God makes may be painful for a season, but they are always the best. Change comes with growth. Growth is what I want in my walk with Christ. I have a precious little Hispanic girl in my group of students at Hall named Mara. Mara is about 5 feet nothing if that much. She came in to her monitor job and asked for a pass to the Media Center to work on a paper. The Media Specialist is also short, but even so, tough. I'm scared of her. She told me the other day that only teachers could give kids passes to the Media Center and I was a counselor, therefore she would tear up my passes, she said, and not let the kid come in. I believed her,

knowing that even though she is short, she could take me out in a minute. I told Mara I couldn't give her a pass because Ms. H. would not accept one from me. Mara reasoned that I was really her "teacher" this particular period and could give her a pass. Long story short, I did give her the pass, but I told her about my misgivings and about not wanting the Media Center person mad at me. Then little bitty Mara, in her broken English said, "Don't worry, Mrs. Flowers, I got your back." As I thought about the changes that may come, whatever they are, I realized something profound from the mouth of a little Hispanic girl. I don't have to be afraid. God has my back! Not only does He have my back, but He goes before me, He is beside me and over me and under me. *"Even to your old age, I shall be the same, and even to your graying years, I shall bear you! I have done it and I shall carry you; and I shall bear you, and I shall deliver you."* Is. 46:4. He surrounds

us with His mercy and grace and protection. We have nothing to fear—not change, not even Media Specialists with attitudes. **God is with me.** Nothing else matters. If He is with me, then He will hold my hand, no matter what is happening around me. In the midst of the chaos of an urban high school, God is with me. In the midst of uncertainty about the future, or elections, or finances, or anything, He is covering me. In the midst of considering changes that might be coming, He leads and guides me. Nothing can separate me from Him. Nothing can take Him away from me. I am inscribed on the palms of His hands. He knows my name. His plans for me are for my welfare and not my destruction, to give me a future and a hope. I am safe in His arms. I don't have to worry. The God of the universe, the Savior, my Creator, Redeemer, my Friend....."has my back."
